for school?



Kindergarten Requirements

Your doctor has been giving your child Immunizations since birth. The yellow card provided by your doctor should have several stamps providing proof that the required immunizations have been given.

Upon registration to school you will need to bring your yellow shot card. If you have been getting your immunizations at the Public Health Dept they can provide you with a printout.



- If you would like your child's Immunization record placed in the data base for safe keeping you can talk to your local Public Health Nurse. She can verify that your child is up to date and provide additional information about other immunizations that are available.

Polio 3 doses between the ages of 7-17 at least 1 dose after the 2nd Birthday

Tdap Booster Is highly recommended if more then 5 years have passed since last DPT, or TD.

IMMUNIZATIONS NOT REQUIRED — but are recommended

Hep A

Is a serious liver disease caused by the hepatitis A virus. It is found in the stool of persons with hepatitis A. It is usually spread by close personal contact and sometimes by eating contaminated food or drink.

Meningococcal Vaccination

(Recommended for High School and College students)

Meningococcal disease is a serious bacterial infection. It can cause meningitis-severe swelling of the brain and spinal cord. It can also lead to sepsis-a dangerous and potentially life-threatening blood infection. The bacteria are spread through air droplets (coughing, sneezing) and by direct contact with an infected person (kissing, sharing a drinking glass).

Tdap Tetanus Booster

Is not required but highly recommended for those students that may have an injury that results in a break in the skin.



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
