Policy 3515.7: Firearms On School Grounds

| Last Revised Date: 02/21/2018

The Governing Board is committed to providing a safe environment for students, staff, and visitors on campus. The Superintendent or designee shall consult with local law enforcement and other appropriate individuals and agencies to address the security of school campuses.

Pursuant to Penal Code 626.9 (the Gun Free School Zone Act), the possession of a firearm on or within 1,000 feet of school grounds is prohibited, except by a person who meets one of the exceptions specified in law.

Exceptions to General Rule.

Despite the general rule above, a person may possess a firearm in a school zone:

- Within a place of residence or place of business or on private property, if that location is not part of the school grounds and the possession of the firearm is otherwise lawful (Penal Code 626.9(e)(4));
- When the firearm is an unloaded handgun, pistol, or revolver and is in a locked container or within the locked trunk of a motor vehicle (Pen. Code, 626.9(c)(2));
- For the lawful transportation of any other firearm, other than a handgun, in accordance with state law (id.);
- When the person possessing the firearm reasonably believes that he or she is in grave danger because of circumstances forming the basis of a current restraining order issued by a court against another person or persons who has or have been found to pose a threat to his or her life or safety (id., § 626.9(c)(3).) This exception does not apply in certain circumstances involving a mutual restraining order (id., referencing Fam. Code, 6200 et seq.);
- When the person is a licensed gun dealer, manufacturer, importer, or wholesaler, or a member of an authorized military or civilian organization when parading, and the gun is unloaded (Penal Code 626.9(c)(4), referencing id., 25615 and 25625);
- When the person is a guard or messenger of a common carrier or bank who, within the course of his or her employment, transports or delivers money or other valuables (id., 626.9(c)(4), referencing id., 25630 and 25645); or
- When the person is a duly appointed peace officer, honorably retired police officer, or security guard authorized to carry a concealed firearm under state law (id., 626.9(l), (m) and (o)).

The Board is cognizant that Penal Code 626.9 allows for a person with a valid Carry Concealed Weapon (CCW) license to carry a firearm within 1,000 feet of a school.

Miscellaneous Ammunition-Related Rules.

People may also carry ammunition onto school grounds if the ammunition is kept within a locked container or within the locked trunk of a motor vehicle. (Id., § 30310(b)(10).)

With limited exceptions, no person may carry ammunition or reloaded ammunition onto school grounds (Penal Code, 30310(a).). However, this requirement does not apply to peace officers, members of the military, or armored vehicle guards carrying out their official duets, to concealed weapons license holders (CCW), or to individuals who have the written consent of the school district superintendent or equivalent school authority, such as the Chief Business Official. (Penal Code, 30310(b).).

If a district employee observes or suspects that any unauthorized person is in possession of a firearm on or near \$\text{\text{\$\text{Phool}}}\$ grounds or at a school activity, he/she shall immediately notify the \$\text{\text{principal}}\$ direct supervisor or de\text{\$\text{\$\text{\$\text{Phoes}}\$}\$ and law enforcement.

The prohibition against the possession of firearms on school grounds shall be included in the district's comprehensive safety plan and shall be communicated to district staff, parents/guardians, and the community.
