We are pleased to inform you that Scott Valley Unified School District will be implementing a new option available to schools participating in the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs called the Community Eligibility Provision for 2024-2025 School Year.

What does this mean for you and your children attending the school(s) identified above?

Great news for you and your students! All enrolled students of Scott Valley Unified School District are eligible to receive a healthy breakfast and lunch at school at **no charge** to your household each day of the 2024-2025 school year. No further action is required of you. Your child(ren) will be able to participate in these meal programs without having to pay a fee or complete a Free and Reduced Lunch application.
